

EU REACH SVHC DECLARATION

1. REACH REGULATION (EC) No 1907/2006 Article 33(1) - Communication on Substances of Very High Concern

Under REACH (EC No. 1907/2006), the EU chemicals regulation, Article 33 requires suppliers of articles to inform recipients if a Substance of Very High Concern (SVHC) is present above 0.1% weight by weight. This obligation applies at the **article level***, including for complex products made of multiple components. SVHCs are listed on the Candidate List published and regularly updated by the European Chemicals Agency (ECHA). <http://echa.europa.eu/candidate-list-table>

*An *article* is defined as an object which during production is given a special shape, surface or design that determines its function to a greater degree than its chemical composition. Following a 2015 ruling by the European Court of Justice (C-106/14), this requirement applies to each individual component of a complex product—commonly referred to as the “*once an article, always an article*” principle. Once an article has an established duty to declare, this duty remains for whichever more complex article / product this article is used in, even if the article was originally manufactured outside of the EU.
